Leland Lazarus is the Associate Director of Research at Florida International University's Jack D. Gordon Institute for Public Policy. He is the technical expert on China-Latin America relations. Prior to this role, he has served as the Special Assistant and Speechwriter to the Commander of U.S. Southern Command, where he advised the Commander on a broad spectrum of subjects, issues, and policy considerations related to China in Latin America and the Caribbean. He also helped develop SOUTHCOM's counter-PRC strategic messaging and provided focused support with operational and strategic research to the Commander. He has also served as a State Department Foreign Service Officer, as Deputy Public Affairs Officer at U.S. Embassy Barbados and the Eastern Caribbean; Consular Officer at the U.S. Consulate General in Shenyang, China; Pickering Fellow at U.S. Embassy Beijing; and the China Desk in DC.



Mario Montoto is President of the TAEDA Foundation and TAEDA Publishing House. He leads these specialized entities in organizing events and seminars addressing global strategic issues such as natural resources, technology, and sustainable development with technological innovation. Additionally, he is responsible for the DEF Magazine, a monthly publication covering topics of Latin American interest related to regional growth, environment, energy, defense, public security, science, and technology. Throughout his career, he also serves as the President of the Argentine-Israeli Chamber of Commerce. Moreover, Montoto is a shareholder in various companies developing solutions and systems, applying technology to public safety and defense.



Dr. Kenneth A. Jessell is the president of Florida International University. He was unanimously approved by the FIU Board of Trustees as president-designate on Oct. 17, 2022, and confirmed by the Florida Board of Governor<u>s on Nov. 9, 2022, as</u> the sixth president of FIU. Prior to his appointment as interim president in January of 2022, Dr. Jessell served as Senior Vice President for Finance and Administration and Chief Financial Officer at FIU from 2009-2022. At this position, he was responsible for the management and administration of financial, facility and business service operations of the university. Dr. Jessell is also a professor of finance in the College of Business Administration at FIU. Prior to his time at FIU, Dr. Jessell served as the Senior Vice President for Financial Affairs at Florida Atlantic University.



General Laura J. Richardson is a native of Northglenn, Colorado and a graduate of Metropolitan State University of Denver, Colorado. She was commissioned into the U.S. Army and trained as an Army Aviator. She holds a Master of Science in National Resource Strategy from the National Defense University's Dwight D. Eisenhower School for National Security and Resource Strategy. General Richardson previously served as the Commanding General of U.S. Army North (Fifth Army) at Fort Sam Houston, Texas, which is the Army Service Component Command for U.S. Northern Command. Other assignments as a General Officer include Deputy Commanding General of U.S. Army Forces Command at Fort Bragg, North Carolina; Chief of Army Legislative Liaison to the U.S. Congress in Washington D.C.

Daniel P. Erikson is the Special Assistant to the President and Senior Director for Western Hemisphere Affairs. He was previously Managing Director at Blue Star Strategies, LLC, where he led the firm's Latin American practice. He was also a Senior Fellow at the Penn Biden Center for Diplomacy and Clobal Engagement. He has also served in the White House as Special Advisor to the Vice President, where he focused on Western Hemisphere Affairs and covered foreign affairs and national security issues. In addition to his U.S. government experience, he has held senior positions in the private sector, think tanks, and academia. He has been published widely on a range of topics related to international and Latin American and Caribbean affairs and has testified before the U.S. Congress.



Brian Fonseca is the Director of the Jack D. Gordon Institute for Public Policy at FIU's Steven J. Green School of International and Public Affairs. He serves as the Institute's technical expert for national security and foreign policy. His analysis has been featured in local and national media, including ABC, BBC, Bloomberg, Fox News, MSNBC, and the Miami Herald. He also serves as WSVN-Fox 7's on-air political expert. He joined the Gordon Institute in 2015 after serving as director of operations at FIU's Applied Research Center, where he led the center's expansion into national security and cybersecurity research initiatives. President Santiago Peña Palacios was born on November 16, 1978, in the city of Asunción, Capital of the Republic of Paraguay and is the youngest president of the democratic era to occupy the presidential seat. The President has been married for 25 years to Leticia Ocampos, an architect by profession. He became a father at the age of 17 and has two children, Gonzalo and Costanza. After studying Economics at the Nuestra Señora de la Asunción Catholic University, he obtained the title of economist and later traveled to the United States, where he completed a master's degree in Public Administration at Columbia University in New York.



General Tim Ray, USAF (Ret.) is a highly decorated, retired United States Air Force Four-Star General officer who most recently served as Commander of Air Force Global Strike Command. Concurrently he served as the Commander of Air Forces Strategic-Air, United States Strategic Command with a focus on strategy and operational excellence. He served as a member of the Air Force's "Corporate Board" team of senior leaders, shaping future force structure, modernization, and budget priorities for the United States Air Force. General Ray is widely recognized for developing, fielding, operating, and sustaining security capabilities as a result of his vast experience and insights across multiple disciplines: technology development and acquisition, joint and combined military operations from the tactical to the strategic, executive leadership, civil-military relationships, and international

Dr. Carlos Díaz-Rosillo is the Founding Director of the Adam Smith Center for Economic Freedom. He is an accomplished educator, administrator, political and policy entrepreneur and strategist, public communicator, and former senior government official. He has worked at the highest levels of the United States government, serving as Deputy Assistant to the President and Director of Policy and Interagency Coordination at the White House, Senior Deputy Chairman and Chief Operating Officer of the National Endowment for the Humanities, and Acting Principal Deputy Assistant Secretary of Defense for International Security Affairs. He also served as a senior member of the 2016-2017 presidential transition.



Nick Schumann enlisted in the US Army Reserve in 2003 and gained a direct commission as an officer in 2007. He currently serves as a Major in the US Army Reserve with more than 19 years of service. As a Reservist, Nick is currently attached to United States Southern Command (Southcom), which is based in Miami, FL. He deployments to the Middle East while enlisted, and after gaining his commission and going through the Officer Basic Course and functional area school, Nick began looking for roles in the public sector. Luckily, he was able to join the US Treasury's Office of Terrorism and Financial Intelligence, the Treasury's national security division. Nick was hired into this role by a fellow Army veteran he had served with in Kuwait



Maria Lourdes Teran is Vice President of the Americas Society/Council of the Americas and head of the AS/COA Miami office. With over 25 years of experience working with Latin America, she leads business-relevant public policy programs in Miami engaging public- and private-sector leaders, NGOs, foundations, and academics on a range of business and policy issues as well as C-level leadership forums for CEOs and CFOs of major multilatinas and multinational companies across the Western Hemisphere. Teran leads corporate membership, strategic partnerships, and alliances for AS/COA Miami, in addition to building the BRAVO Leadership Forums series and the annual Symposium & BRAVO Business Awards and in-country programs in Mexico, Brazil, Argentina, Colombia, and Peru.

Óscar Eduardo Rocha is the Director of Social Studies at FEMSA. He also currently chairs the Security and Justice Commission of the Nuevo León Council. He has worked in areas of social communication at the Secretariat of Programming and Budget and at the Presidency of the Republic (88-92), and has served as Minister for Special Affairs at the Embassy of Mexico in Washington DC (95-2000) and was advisor to the Secretary of Finance and Public Credit on national security matters (2000). Between 2001 and 2005 he organized different academic activities, including the Diploma in National Security at ITAM, and was a business consultant. In 2005 he joined the Center for Investigation and National Security, and later became part of the Federal Police, and the Attorney General's Office, where he established and directed the SIEDO's communications intervention center. In 2010 he left public service and took over the Asset Protection Directorate of Walmart de Mexico. He currently chairs the Security and Justice Commission of the Nuevo León



Patrick Antoine is the Chief Executive Officer and Technical Director of the CARICOM Private Sector Organization (CPSO) Secretariat, the most recent Associate Institution of the Caribbean Community (CARICOM), which serves to mobilize private sector participation in the CARICOM Institutionality. Prior, he has a plethora of experience in Caribbean affairs, as Lead Technical Advisor, Regional Negotiating Machinery, CARICOM Negotiator Agriculture and Market Access, Ambassador to the World Trade Organization; Ambassador to CARICOM; Republic of Trinidad and Tobago; Ambassador with responsibility for External Negotiations, and Chief Economic and Policy Advisor to the Government of Grenada. Dr. Antoine was appointed Special Advisor to the Director General of the Inter-American Institute for Cooperation on Agriculture (IICA) between 2018-2020.



Yanina Kogan is the Director of the TAEDA Foundation. As the Foundation's Director, she leads training and cooperation programs in strategic areas such as connectivity, climate change, and inclusive development. Minister Oscar González Cañete is the Minister of National Defense of Paraguay. In his military career, he has held the positions of Platoon Commander, Company Commander, Chief of Staff of the Presidential Escort Regiment, Commander of the Security Battalion of the Presidential Escort Regiment, Head of Security of the Residence facilities Presidential "Mburuvichá Roga", Head of Security of the First Lady of the Nation, Director of the Army Language Institute, Head of the Military Cabinet of the Ministry of National Defense, Secretary General of the Ministry of National Defense and Defense Attaché of the Embassy of the Republic of Paraguay in the Plurinational State of Bolivia. He has taught at the Institute of Higher Strategic Studies (IAEE), at the Army Command and General Staff School and at the Officers' Improvement School. In 2015 he was promoted to Army General and in 2016 he retired; When the general elections in 2023 resulted in Santiago Peña as the winner, the president appointed him head of the Ministry of National Defense.



Minister José Mucio Monteiro Filho is the Minister of Defense of Brazil. He is a civil engineer graduated from the Polytechnic School of the University of Pernambuco (UPE) in 1971. Prior, he has served in elected terms as mayor of the Pernambuco municipality of Rio Formoso (1982 to 1983) and federal deputy (1991 to 2011). Among his main parliamentary activities, he was national president of the PFL (1992 to 1993); PTB leader in the Chamber of Deputies; and leader of the Government, from March 7, 2007 to November 30, 2007. In his public career, he held many positions of leadership, to include President of Companhia Energética de Pernambuco (Celpe) in 1983; secretary of Transport, Communication and Energy of the State of Pernambuco (1983 to 1986); municipal secretary of Planning, Urbanism and Environment of Recife (1997 to 1998); and head minister of the Secretariat of Institutional Relations of the Presidency of the Republic (2007 to 2009).



Ambassador Gabriel Gaspar is the former Undersecretary of Defense of Chile, serving from 2022-2023. Prior, he has served the Chilean government as Ambassador on Chile's Special mission to Bolivia's maritime demand to the Haque: Undersecretary for the Chilean Armed Forces; Ambassador to Cuba, Colombia; and Undersecretary of War of Chile. He is also the author of numerous publications in universities and academic centers in Latin America, Europe and Russia. He has also taught classes in the Army War academies, the Chilean Air Force, National for Political and Strategic Studies (ANEPE) of the Ministry of Defense of Chile, and the Chilean Diplomas and the Institute of Political Science of the University of Chile. He international media on Latin American political current affairs, security and defense, neighborhood relations and integration issues.



Jason Marczak is Vice President and Senior Director of the Atlantic Council's Adrienne Arsht Latin America Center. He joined the Council in 2013 to launch the center and set the strategic direction for its work. Marczak has over twenty years of expertise in regional economics, politics, and development, working with high-level policymakers and private-sector executives to shape public policy. He graduated from Irkutsk State University, in Russia, majoring in history and international relations, and he also holds MA and PhD in International Development and Cooperation from Hiroshima University in Japan.Before joining Icesi University in 2007, Vladimir worked with the Japan Society for the Promotion of Science (JSPS), education and research institutions in Russia, Japan, and Colombia, and he speaks Russian, English, and Spanish.



Evan Ellis is a Research Professor of Latin American Studies at the U.S. Army War College Strategic Studies Institute, with a focus on the region's relationships with China and other non-Western Hemisphere actors, as well as transnational organized crime and populism in the region. He has published over 300 works, including books on China in Latin America, and Transnational Organized Crime in Latin America and the Caribbean. He previously served on the Secretary of State's Policy Planning Staff (S/P) with responsibility for Latin America and the Caribbean (WHA), as well as International Narcotics and Law Enforcement (INL) issues. He has been awarded the Order of Military Merit José María Córdova by the Colombian government for his scholarship on security issues in the region.



Fabián Calle is a Senior Fellow at the Jack D. Gordon Institute for Public Policy, and a columnist and editorial advisor for DEF Taeda magazine. He is also a Professor at the Torcuato Di Tella University, UCEMA, Argentine Catholic University, Universita di Bologna and Joint War School of the Armed Forces. He has served as an advisor to the Minister of Defense Horacio Jaunarena, and to the Bapro Group, as well as been an analyst at the General Staff of the Navy.

Jin (Julie) Zeng is Associate Professor of Politics and International Relations at investment in Latin America, agrarian studies in contemporary China, and political economy of development. She is the author of the book, State-Led Privatization in China-The Politics of Economic Reform (Routledge, 2013). In the book, she examines the initiation, implementation, and dynamics of privatization in China. Building on rich fieldwork data gathered in three Chinese cities, the book offers the first comparative study of China's privatization processes at the local level. She has also published articles in scholarly journals such as The Journal of Peasant Studies, Third World Quarterly, Journal of Chinese Political Science, and Asian Perspective.



Shlomi Dinar is the Dean of the Steven J. Green School of International and Public Affairs and a Professor in the Department of Politics and International Relations. His research interests lie at the intersection of international environmental politics, security, and negotiation. In particular, he has published in the area of conflict and cooperation over transboundary rivers (a field popularly known as 'hydro-politics'). In addition, he works on the linkages between climate change and international water issues, particularly as such a relationship pertains to the resilience and effectiveness of international river basins and institutions, respectively. Dinar's research includes other areas and topics such as the nexus between political demography and technology and terrorism.
