He is an expert on China-Latin America relations, and manages a team of researchers and interns that collect data and analysis on U.S. national security and governance in Latin America and the Caribbean.

Jeanette M. Nuñez is the Interim President of Florida International University. She was appointed to this position on February 7, 2025. Prior to her appointment as Interim President, Mrs. Nuñez served as Florida's Lieutenant Governor. She was first elected in 2018 and subsequently re-elected in 2022. Admiral Alvin Holsey is Commander of U.S. Southern Command. Adm. Holsey is a native of Fort Valley, Georgia and was commissioned through the Naval Reserve Officers Training Corps (NROTC) program at Morehouse College in 1988, where he received a degree in Computer Science. He earned a Master of Science in Management from Troy State University in 1995 and attended the Joint Forces Staff College in 2010.





Eric Farnsworth is the Vice President of the Council of the Americas and the Americas Society. He leads the Washington office of AS/COA with a passion for promoting the importance of the Western Hemisphere for U.S. economic, security, and strategic interests. A recognized expert, he maintains an important policy leadership and advocacy role across a broad range of issues.



Frank O. Mora, Ph.D., is professor of politics and international relations at Florida International University. Dr. Mora is a former U.S. ambassador to the Organization of American States. From 2013 to 2020, Dr. Mora served as director of the Kimberly Green Latin American and Caribbean Center at FIU. He was also a senior researcher at FIU's Jack D. Gordon Institute for Public Policy.



Dan Restrepo served as the principal advisor to President Barack Obama on issues related to Latin America, the Caribbean, and Canada, serving as special assistant to the president and senior director for Western Hemisphere affairs at the National Security Council from March 2009 to July 2012 and as an advisor to and surrogate for Obama for America during the 2008 and 2012 campaigns.



Juan Cruz is a Senior Advisor of Dinámica Americas.

Juan retired as a senior U.S. government executive who served in Latin America in various roles, culminating a nearly 35-year government career as President Trump's Special Assistant for the Western Hemisphere and top National Security Council advisor for the Americas.



Arantxa Loizaga has served as the Network News Anchor for NBCUniversal Telemundo Enterprises for 13 years. She has covered multiple international stories on the field that include the killing of 43 students from Ayotizinapa, Guerrero, Mexico back in 2014, the recapture of "El Chapo" in 2016 and "La Tuta" drug lord, and many other breaking news. She is a four-time winner of the the Lone Star Emmy Award, and was nominated 10 times for the award.





Gerard Johnson is a development economist with degrees from Georgetown University and the University of Kent at Canterbury. He also studied economics at Complutense University in Madrid. He worked for most of his professional career with the Inter-American Development Bank, his last posting being General Manager for the Caribbean Department. He met his wife while working with the University of the West Indies.



Martín Redrado is currently a Visiting Professor at Florida International University (2024-2025) and serves as the Director of the Master in Central Banking program at Asia Business School (2019-present). He is also the Director of Fundación Capital, a prominent economic research and public policy think tank (2010-present).


